UMP expands international collaboration network with German Konstanz University of Applied Sciences

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PAYA BESAR, 15 December 2021 - Universiti Malaysia Pahang (UMP) signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with Konstanz University of Applied Sciences (HTWG-Konstanz) Germany in expanding the network of international collaboration and further strengthening the relationship between the two universities.

The online ceremony saw Professor Dato' Ts. Dr. Yuserrie Zainuddin, who performs the functions of the Vice-Chancellor of UMP, signed the MoU while HTWG-Konstanz was represented by its President, Professor Dr. Sabine Rein.

Also present were the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic and International), Professor Ts. Dr. Mohd. Mohd Rosli Hainin, Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research and Innovation), Professor Ts. Dr. Kamal Zuhairi Zamli, Director of DAAD Malaysia Kuala Lumpur and Board of Directors of UMP's German Studies Programme and Vice President of HTWG-Konstanz, Professor Dr. Katrin Klodt-Bußmann.

According to Professor Dato' Ts. Yuserrie, this MoU is an important milestone for UMP especially to the Faculty of Industrial Management (FPI), the German Academic Collaboration Centre and Centre for International Relations to continue establishing strategic collaboration in academics and research.
