However, she said on 26 January 2021, her grandmother took her last breath at Hospital Sultanah Nur Zahirah, Terengganu.

"To be honest, I feel like giving up but I put my best foot forward because I want to prove my success to my late grandma and be strong for my brother.

"I always tell myself not to get driven by emotions and believe Allah SWT's plan is the best," she said.
