Tan Sri Dato' Sri Dr. Abdul Aziz said riding therapy activities applied to people with disabilities (OKU) are seen to give positive development to children and thus be a healing therapy for various types of diseases.

"It will also provide trained expertise and strengthen the soft skills of UMP students to contribute to the development of the community," he said.

He hoped that this collaboration would provide an opportunity for UMP students to contribute their expertise and knowledge by learning riding therapy techniques and become a support group for trained volunteers in the future.



At the same time, this collaboration would also open up more opportunities to be explored on equestrian therapy in the country.

Meanwhile, this collaboration also allows UMP students to hold periodic training in Equestrian Orientation Clinics held at the Pahang Equestrian Complex, Tanjung Lumpur.
