Pahang investment, industries, science, technology and innovation committee chairman, Datuk Mohamad Nizar Najib, said investing in innovations helps the country stimulate entrepreneurship, attract foreign investment, and increase their competitiveness in the global market.

"Innovation helps promote sustainable development by addressing environmental challenges and promoting resource efficiency in line with the 12th Malaysia Plan

which aims to change the country's conventional linear economic model to a sustainable circular or recycling focused economy.

"Cultivating innovation is the current challenge in Malaysia and we are grateful to Universiti Malaysia Pahang Al-Sultan Abdullah (UMPSA) for always adopting the culture of innovation as their main agenda in the university's achievements," he said in his speech during UMPSA's Cendekia Bitara Award-Prowess Craftsmanship at a hotel here last night.
