UMPSA organises korban and akikah in conjunction with Aidiladha

PEKAN, 19 June 2024 – In an effort to enliven the atmosphere in conjunction with Hari Raya Aidiladha and towards the end of Tashriq day, the Islamic and Human Development Centre (PIMPIN), Universiti Malaysia Pahang Al-Sultan Abdullah (UMPSA) successfully carried out the korban and akikah programme.

The programme saw as many as eight cows and two goats being slaughtered at the University Mosque, UMPSA Pekan.

The programme was also graced by the presence of the UMPSA Vice-Chancellor, Professor Dato' Ts. Dr. Yuserrie Zainuddin with his wife, Datin Nooraziza Sabarudin who was also doing the korban.

"This time, the process of slicing and cutting meat is done in a spacious and comfortable place at the UMPSA Mosque.

"Thank you to all UMPSA staff who arrived as early as 8:00 am to help manage this korban activity," he said.

One of the international students from Egypt, Abdelrahman Mohamed Ismail Farouk, 29, told that he was very excited to participate in this volunteer activity.

"The first time participating in this korban activity is very enjoyable.

"There are many interesting things that I learned, especially in the process of slaughtering cows that are managed very professionally and I am excited to see here in Malaysia that there are many who will help in this activity.
